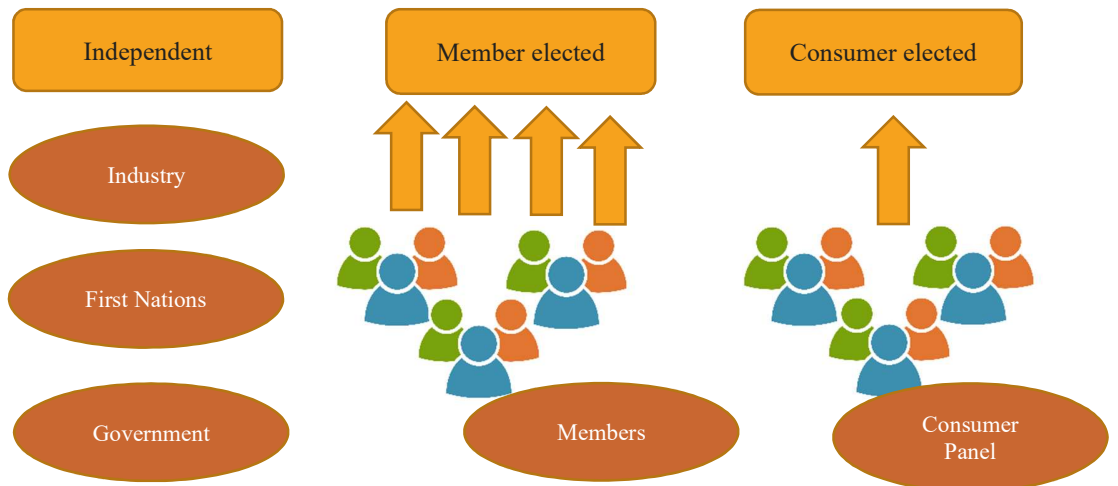

Collective Action Social Impact Ltd

Collective Action Social Impact Ltd is a collaboration of committed health and human service organisations and other individuals passionate about improving mental health, alcohol and other drugs support that work collaboratively to enact transformational change for improved health and wellbeing outcomes for the people of the Gladstone region. The collaboration has a broad membership across non-government and government agencies. As a collective impact initiative, we will bring together research, government and non-government organisations and the community to work collaboratively on initiatives that empower the Gladstone community to achieve measureable improvements in wellbeing. The two main activities of Collective Action Social Impact Ltd are providing a community gateway and leading and facilitating a collective impact approach as a backbone organisation.

Collective Action Social Impact Ltd's governance model facilitates a membership based collective and the Board is comprised of a diverse and comprehensive mix of competencies and perspectives with four member elected Board directors, four independent Board directors representative of industry, First Nations and government. Once the service is operational, a consumer panel will be established and a consumer elected person will also become a Board director.
